Come join the Exiles for a fun-filled and informative evening, as our guest panelists talk about their lives, and answer your questions about leather, BDSM, kinky sex, women and genderqueer identities. Any and all questions are welcome!

Our panelists this year include: Angel, a queer and slave identified girl who's active in the leather community, Madame Butterfly, a bisexual femme bondage expert who makes her own rope; Ray, a genderqueer polyamorous Dominant who heads her own leather family, Sailor Alecs, a transgendered owned and collared switch; Tracy, a bisexual femme activist and the first Women's International Leather Legacy Titleholder; Trinity, a submissive

queer and American Leatherwoman 2011; Val, a butch-identified polyamorous lesbian masochist; and Zed, a bottom-heavy sadomasochist switch and a non-femme leathergirl.

Directions to The Women's Building

Public Transit BART - The Women's Building is close to 16th street BART. Special note: one side-effect of gentrification in the Mission is that there are a lot of people on the streets between The Women's Building and the BART station - all nice safe people going to one of the many new local restaurants. You'll probably feel safe walking the few blocks from 16th Mission BART and The Women's Building.

Muni - The 22 Fillmore runs down 16th Street. Get off at 16th & Valencia and walk two blocks to The Women's Building. The 14 Mission runs along Mission Street. Get off at 17th or 18th and walk 1-1/2 blocks to TWB.

Parking Garage - Street parking is difficult in this neighborhood. There is an inexpensive locked parking garage available on 21st St. between Valencia and Mission and 16th and on Hoff St between Mission and Valencia.

June Program Report: Fisting Workshop

The June program was an interactive workshop on the art of vaginal fisting held at The Women's Building in San Francisco. We were graciously lent the slings from The Hell Hole for this workshop. The presenters were Val and Rio with Marilyn as a very lovely demo bottom. We had a relatively small turnout for this event but that just make it seem even more intimate.

Val began the workshop with explaining why we fist. Fisting is a true act of an intense power exchange, she explained. Not only do you have to be comfortable with each other for it to be successful, you have to keep trying. Val reminded us that not everyone can be fisted, and not to become discouraged if you find that you can't fist your partner. We all have differently shaped anatomy.

Val explained that the most important parts of fisting is communication and lube. Gloves are also an essential part of the experience, not only for safety but because it provides a smoother surface and can assist in insertion.

Rio demonstrated the "quack like a duck" technique that is favored for working the hand into the orifice, as Val demonstrated the slow working up of adding digits into the orifice until all the digits are inserted and the duck like motion is achieved. Both Val and Rio stressed that lube is essential and that there is no such thing as too much, especially as you get closer to slipping the ring of knuckles on your hand into the orifice.

Both Val and Marilyn explained that the use of slings are not essential in fisting but can be extremely useful as it provides a swinging motion for the bottom to assist in the activity. Some of the techniques Val explained was to try going in palm up or palm down as you work the muscle open. It's also essential to be sexually turned on first, and a vibrator was suggested to be used either during or before to help the muscles relax, but this depends entirely on how your body works.

Marilyn explained that once the whole fist is inserted there is a very full feeling that can be very emotionally intense. As Val slowly rocked her fist in and out and in a rotating motion, Rio demonstrated so that we could visualize how it was being done. Rio also explained that this activity also makes hitting the G-Spot much easier and therefore potentially can create very intense orgasms.

Once you are done you may need to break the vacuum seal that can be created by the

sliding of your hand in and out. Val suggested using your other hand to break the seal first before coordinating slowly pulling your hand back out. Marilyn says women who have had children are familiar with the sensation and "pushing out" that the bottom will need to do to help your partner remove their hand easier. Once the hand is removed there is a very empty feeling, there can be some slight bleeding and it's essential to urinate right after fisting to avoid a bladder infection.

After the break people were encouraged to try fisting in the various slings set up around the room. There were a few people brave enough to play but most seemed a little intimidated. Rio and Val floated around the room encouraging and assisting in verbal techniques for those who were attempting to play. It was a very fun and intimate demonstration and we look forward to our next program and sharing information with the community.
