Come join the Exiles for a fun-filled and informative evening, as a panel talks about their lives and answers your questions about leather, BDSM, kinky sex, gender, and sexual identities. Any and all questions are welcome!

This year's panelists include a range of women and genderqueer people who identify as femme, butch, and neither; Tops, Dominants, and Masters; slaves, bottoms, and submissives; monogamous and polyamorous; sadists, masochists, straight, lesbian, queer, bisexual, gay, and everything in-between!

They'll each talk about how they came into the scene, then we'll open the floor for questions. This is the chance for newcomers to find out what BDSM is all about and get answers to questions about the scene in a friendly and nonjudgmental environment.

For the second half of the program we'll have sampler stations where you can try a wide range of BDSM activities, either giving or receiving (or just watching). You can sample flogging, spanking, caning, bondage, violet wands, and more. Try them all and see what you like!

# **June Program Report**

#### Feel the Steel: The Art and Magic of Needle Play

With Cleo Dubois and Friends

Presenter Cleo Dubois began the program with some discussion of the energy that is pulled from piercing and the ways that needle play can be ritual. Cleo noted that the program was less than 24 hours after the solstice and less than 48 hours before the full moon, so she encouraged people to participate in the second half of the program to personally experience that power. Cleo displayed a slide presentation of many beautiful examples of her work, during which she discussed her pleasure and experience with this art form. She also showed us some photos she had taken of piercing rituals that are part of other cultures, and talked about the ancient understanding of the power of these rituals.

The second part of her presentation was a piercing of her lovely assistant Crystal. Cleo created a stunning necklace of 22 gauge needles all pointing up toward her head. Many in the audience were impressed by how Crystal was able to stand there without moving through the entire experience.

After the break there was a practical demo. Cleo pierced a number of women who were quite pleased for the opportunity, some of whom had not been pierced before. Many of the piercings had string attached, allowing others to pull on them for a deeper sensation. Cleo's assistant Pat gave instruction to people interested in learning to pierce. It was a very high energy program, and a wonderful time was had by all.





#### 9th Annual Queer Women of Color Film Festival

Bennett, Val, and Carmela represented the Exiles on opening night of the Queer Women of Color Film Festival on Friday, June 14th at the Brava Theater Center in San Francisco. This event, organized by the Queer Women of Color Media Arts Project, is now in its ninth year, and the Exiles have been a community partner of the film festival for the last several years.

Randi recognized all of the organizers and volunteers for the IMsL hospitality suite and Countess for getting the May program info on the website so fast. Val recognized Randi for stepping in with great energy on PR, and Marilyn recognized Suzanne, for doing an awesome job on her first newsletter.

#### **Core Business:**

**Review of online decisions:** We will not do a club donation to LLW due to lack of funds; individuals are encouraged to donate.

**Postmortem of IMsL Hospitality Suite**: It was fun. The chocolates were tasty, and though they were late, we had other things going on so it was okay. Angel sent an email card to the Seattle goL. There were great volunteers. Some Exiles volunteers didn't show up. Need to impress on people the importance of their participation. Say something to people who volunteered and didn't show up. We don't have invoices yet, so we don't have financial numbers yet. \$32 in tips collected. We asked in advance if we could do a fundraiser and Glenda said no, but other groups did it; they just didn't ask in advance. There was a perfect amount of drinks. More people drank juice. We bought champagne flutes from Tracy at thirty cents each, which was less than renting. (Originally thought they were eighty cents each, so there was a money concern – no issue.)

**Northwest Leather Celebration**: Rio is the main coordinator. We have all the chocolates and supplies we need. The only thing we need to do is buy the beverages and get another volunteer

**QWOCMAP Queer Women of Color Film Festival:** The Exiles are again a community partner for this event. We give money, provide volunteers, and cross-promote. Val and Bennett are running it for the Exiles. Bennett paid \$200 out of her own pocket and will cover it if we can't. Cross-promotion and other logistics discussed.

Leather Week/Folsom Street Fair: Lou will start discussion on email biz list.

#### **New Business:**

**Membership:** Marilyn discussed changing the default email options on membership form and will create a mockup and send to group for review.

**Reciprocity with Bad Girls of Portland (Oregon):** Proposed by Marilyn. Unanimous vote in favor of this proposition.

Volunteer Forms: Lou will keep for now.

Programs: Discussion of whether or not we need a break during our programs was postponed.

**PR:** Discussions of holding Exiles orientation at the DeFrank Center in San Jose and having programs on Sundays post-orientations were postponed. Leather Alley at SF Pride: Lou and Rio will discuss on biz list. Val will connect with Rover.

**Officer Reports:** These reports were noted but not discussed.
