Q has presented on a number of topics both abroad and in the U.S. An activist for over fifteen years and a certified sex educator, he is passionate about bringing together the various communities he is part of through education and adult film. This charming and flirtatious southern boi resides in Oakland, travels extensively for work and play, and is always on the lookout for new adventures along the way. April Program Report

Zemis presented the program **Whips from Erotic Pleasure to Cathartic Needs**, but it was really about *connection* – with the use of whips as the conductor of the connection. Using whips is a way of staying in the moment and being present.

For Zemis, whips are not *just* about connection but also about music, rhythm, dancing, giggles, and tuning out the world and tuning in to the inner world. She exemplifies the "play" in playing. In connecting with her bottom, she listens carefully to voice, body language, breathing, and facial expression. Creativity is key as is being spontaneous.

The hit of a whip keeps the bottom connected to her. She spoke at length about technique, different types of whips (and handed them out for us to look at), and how to care for them. If the top is having trouble getting the whip to hit the mark, maybe the whip needs to be "rolled." She demonstrated hitting her bottom with a blanket over her and said that was a good way to start with a new partner, as a way to build trust. She also mentioned different kinds of "mind fucks" (e.g., tying one leg down and letting the other leg be free).

Zemis discussed her "whip teachers," and it was clear that Zemis has been studying and practicing for years to become as proficient as she is. She made it look easy, like any athlete with an advanced skill level.

Zemis, as a play partner, is the best of both worlds: a top who is highly skilled in technique but is also playful, creative, connected, and knows that what it's really about is the intimacy we create when we play with each other.

Queer Women of Color Media Arts Project: QWOCMAP would like us to again partner with them. Their film festival is June 13-15 at the Brava Theater in SF. This is not in our budget, but individual members will make contributions to make this possible.

Folsom Meet & Greet: Folsom Street Fair is a week earlier this year, the same week as our program. Proposed and voted that we have a meet & greet followed by a party in lieu of a September program. Val, as local titleholder, happy to cohost. Rio and Jessica will research venues.

Proposal: Exiles patches given to early membership renewers. First twenty people who renew their membership, starting June 1, will receive a small Exiles patch. We have inventory already.

Proposal: Raise household membership rate. This rate was first proposed when the cost of printing and mailing newsletters was high. That is no longer the case with e-delivery, so this rate is no longer cost-effective for the club; in fact, it's now detrimental to the club's finances. We have six times as many household memberships (\$42, no matter how many people are in household) than we do individual members (\$36 each). Proposal is to keep individual rate at \$36 and change household rate as follows: \$54 for the first two members (i.e., second person pays half-price), and \$15 each for every additional person in household. This would be a policy change, so it was discussed at this meeting and will be voted upon at the June meeting.

Report on *Consent Matters* **panel** was not given due to time constraints. Marilyn will send out an email about this.

Lou's mailbox and storage keys: who should these go to?

Next month: should online voting be expanded

Policy change: Proposed change to online voting section as it relates to expenses. Will be published in the April Fringe. All business meeting attendees should be sure that their cell phone numbers are listed (and current) in Google docs spreadsheet.

Officer Reports: Noted but not discussed.

Co-coordinator (Rio): Asked for quote on Exiles patches. Pins have been ordered and will be ready in time for IMsL.

Treasurer (Angel): \$4,056.99 balance; \$441.50 O/s expenses to clear; \$3,615.49 available funds. \$443 due from The Eagle Beer bust.

Orientation (Val): Ten people attended. One renewal and six new members joined.

Doorkeeper (Lee, reported by Marilyn): Six attendees at March program: five members (including three officers) and one non-member. Free program, so no money collected. Misha received a lesson in how to do the door.

Membership (Marilyn): No new members this month, although got a couple of contacts about renewing. Starting to think about renewal season.

Website Manager (Countess): Website visits are up dramatically, from 614 to 1008. Last month was the best month in the past year. The vast majority of this increase is from organic search 300 to 634 – more than doubling. This is due to recent changes in the website content and structure, including the pings (calls) to Google and other search engines when new content is added to our website. Countess does not wish to see reappointment.
