# Staying Sharp- Knife Play for Everyone — October's Program Review

October's program delivered on all the hype of being a HOT program. The presenter, Karen (Estrella) shared her wealth of knowledge about knife play and presented four very hot demos on techniques for incorporating knife play into your scenes. Karen brought her twenty-five years of BDSM experience to the presentation including many years of knife play.

The demos included: cutting someone out of saran wrap and clothing; spanking followed by poking with a knife and drawing blood; rope bondage, white lining and vaginal penetration using a knife; and an interrogation scene that included various forms of knife play including heating the knife, white lining, slapping with a very large knife and scratching with a knife after application of a taser.

Between demos, Karen covered several areas about knives and knife play including basic safety and care of the knives including the different materials that knives can be made of, cleaning, sharpening and the different types of knives. She also covered safety for the top and bottom, especially when blood is present, negotiating knife play, and after care for both tops and bottoms. The audience also contributed to the shared information by offering their knife play experiences and comments.

This program drew a large crowd, about 50 people, including various levels of experience from newbies to very experienced. The program ran very long but not many attendees left.



# Policy changes voted on at the business meeting

How the Exiles is run is described in two documents: the Articles, which define the basics of our organization, and the Policies, which describe the nitty-gritty of how we do things. Changes to the Articles require a vote of the membership – look for that in March. Changes to the Policies can be done at business meetings. First, the change is proposed and seconded, then it is published in the Fringe, then it is discussed and voted on at the next business meeting.

The following Policy changes were approved at the last business meeting:

- Program entry for members has been changed from \$4 to \$5. This will become effective after the first of the year.
- Free business ads are allowed in the Fringe for members. (Free personal ads are already allowed.) The ads must be for the member's business.
- Any proposals to the Exiles for programs or other things need to be in writing.
- We request 72-hour advance notice for providing ASL interpretation at meetings.
- The Steering Committee will meet once every calendar year. (The Policies used to dictate that this be in September.)

The full Articles and Policies can be found on the Exiles website. They will be updated soon to reflect the above changes.
