May Program: Leather Families: Putting the Fun in Functional

As many of us can attest, the very structure of how nature forms families can be pretty dysfunctional. Two people who often don't know each other very well produce offspring and everyone spends the next 20 years in therapy.

Those of us who have chosen to be a part of a larger chosen community called leather have watched as families have formed. They can be a place where awesome things can and do happen. But like any family, sometimes it's like herding cats on crack.

Come and discover some of the various reasons why one may want to be part of a leather family, the various ways they can form or be formed, and responsibilities and benefits of being in such a family. We will also discuss some of the pitfalls to be aware of along with problem-solving tools to keep the fun in this functional dynamic. This will be a tripartite program with a short time of instructive and entertaining "lecture," a chance to hear from some or all (hopefully all – see herding cats above), of one such leather family and a time for Q&A.

She has been active for many of those years in Exiles, Dykes on Bikes, attending Leather Conferences and learning more day by day how to live this thing called The Leather Life. April Program Report: (Role) Playing on the Edge by Pat

The April program was very interesting and a little intense at times. Using demonstrations and discussion, Estrella and J explored the boundaries of BDSM with role playing when creating scenes in order to add new edges to your play. They thoroughly covered the practicalities, and possible pitfalls of edge role playing. They also covered the potential of several archetypes of role playing such as resistance, humiliation, taboos, 24/7 roles, cruelty, and more.

There were several demos, all with an emphasis on risk-aware-consensual kink (RACK) principles and how to set the scene, form dynamics, playing with the edge and finally how to come out of the role (or not) and provide aftercare.

One demo focused on interrogation and the creative use of an object, a stun gun, instead of a verbalized safe word in this type of scene. (In this case, the safeword was for the top!)

The next demo was a medical scene that included a death edge scene. After the demo, the discussion was around how the audience had been involved in the scene and offered no assistance to the patient who was being suffocated. The audience participation was interesting in that aspect, discussing how to do these scenes safely when it involves a group.

The last demo involved an abandonment scene between a mother and daughter. This scene was very intense and did trigger some members of the audience. The follow-up discussion was about how to handle those situations when a scene triggers others who are just observers.

The next munch will be Wednesday, June 3rd. We hope to see you there!!




Orientation




Mission Control/Velvet Parties
